A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR In the June issue of Living Lutheran magazine, I found a very interesting article called: "Why we will no longer be a welcoming church." Lutheran Church of the Master in Colorado decided to stop putting their energy into becoming a welcoming church. They changed worship styles, trained greeters and ushers, brewed coffee, and put their friendliest people on the front lines each Sunday morning—all done to become more welcoming to any visitors that came their way.

Sounds pretty familiar, doesn't it? St. Luke is very good at genuine hospitality and gives a warm welcome to anyone coming through the doors. But maybe we can learn something from this sister congregation. They realized that welcoming is not missional. Being welcoming is too passive for a congregation that wants to be doing God's work in the world and making disciples for Jesus. They decided they were no longer going to wait for people to find their way to them, and they now call themselves an invitational church.

Being invitational seemed to be too audacious and frightening at first, so they started doing some exercises to make the task less daunting. Here are five challenges that the congregation tried.

Challenge 1: Try using the phrase "my church" with one person each week. One person, one time each week. "My church is right across the street from the new LaRosa's." It's as simple as that.

Challenge 2: Consider one word or phrase that describes your congregation well, then use that word to finish the phrase: "My church is \_\_\_\_\_." Again, one person, one time each week. "Homelessness? My church is doing something about it."

Challenge 3: Think about one thing your congregation does very well. Use that to finish the phrase: "My church is really good at \_\_\_\_\_\_." I'd say: "My church is really good at loving hurting people and caring for them." One person, one time each week.

**Challenge 4:** Invite one person to check out something in which your congregation is involved. This should be done in appropriate conversations when an opening naturally presents itself. "Doing anything special on July 16th? Sometimes my church just likes to do fun things for the community and we are having a One Day Fun Day. Want to come?" How hard is that?

**Challenge 5:** Invite someone you know to come to worship with you. While this might seem frightening to you, keep in mind that the basis of our identity as people of God is our new life given to us in Jesus Christ. We have so much to offer others with our emphasis on grace and hope.

Please commit to trying these exercises and keep doing them until you are comfortable with them. There are people out there that need the special gifts that St. Luke's disciples have to offer and we need their gifts as well. Let me know how your conversations go!
